
toberu is a place where university faculty & students, (aspiring) entrepreneurs, and corporate intrapreneurs* bring different views to the table, enriching each other daily.

Eligibility

Those who: 1) aspire to start a social venture or have one founded less than a year ago and with an annual sales of less than JPY100M; 2) have an original business idea; 3) make decisions in new business development; 4) are able to join the 4-month residential incubation program at toberu; and 5) agree to give their supporter (SK Impact Fund or Phoenixi/toberu Fund) the right to purchase 3% equity when they have the need for equity financing (stock option also acceptable).
